# Special Delivery: A Renovated Ashland Family Birth Center

Congratulations donors! You helped usher a beautifully renovated Ashland Family Birth Center into the world.

Your generous contributions added a second waterbirth room and shower and gave the entire center an esthetic makeover to create a nurturing and comfortable setting where every family can feel at home during their personalized birthing experience. Asante Ashland Community Hospital CEO Sheila Clough commissioned Erica Ritchie of Erica Ritchie Photography to provide beautiful photographs of Asante Ashland's very own newborns to adorn the walls of the Birth Center.

Bob Mayers, CEO of Adroit Construction Inc., the company that did the renovation, had a multigenerational connection to the project. His son and daughter and two of his grandsons were born at the Birth Center. At each birth, a caring staff made the experience memorable, he says.

"As a family, we feel fortunate to have had two generations be a part of the Ashland Family Birth Center," he says.

Another strong supporter of the Birth Center facelift project, Bob Holbrook watched the progress over the past several months. Earlier this year, Bob toured the hospital





and was touched by the passion of the Birth Center staff as they spoke of their vision of the project and what it would mean to young families in our community.

"My tour of the facility and the enthusiasm of those with whom I spoke made clear both the serious needs of the Birth Center and the opportunity for making a difference," Bob says. "My second tour, during construction, only confirmed me in my commitment."

Committed to the Ashland Family Birth Center's motto, "Your baby, your way," the Asante family is adding three certified nurse-midwives who can give expectant mothers more childbirth options. These new additions to the team — Patricia Reddy, Loretta Sandoval and Pamela Rossio — will collaborate with the hospital's physicians, doulas and other childbirth experts to offer "high-touch, low-tech" care for women with low-risk pregnancies. Certified nurse-midwives specialize in natural childbirth, massage, water laboring and other pain-management techniques.

Every time a baby is born at the Ashland Family Birth Center, Brahms' Lullaby plays over the hospital intercom system. Hum along with us now as we welcome an updated space and expanded services for growing families.

## Record Number of Students Receive Nursing Scholarships

Thirteen Rogue Valley nursing students enrolled in the Oregon Health Science University nursing program received a record-setting \$81,000 in financial assistance for the 2016-17 school year from the William G. and Ruth T. Evans Endowed Nursing Scholarship. An additional sixteen graduating students enrolled in the Rogue Community College Practical Nursing program received scholarships totaling \$6,792 to cover the cost of their state application and exam fees.

This is the largest amount awarded since Ruth Evans, herself an Army nurse during World War II, established the scholarship program in 2002. Students receiving scholarship help this year are pursuing nursing degrees at OHSU at Southern Oregon University and RCC and intend to work in the Rogue Valley after graduation.

"We are fortunate that Mrs. Evans anticipated the current nursing shortage and created a solution," says Marjorie Lininger, scholarship selection committee chair. "Because of her forethought, we can provide scholarships that train nurses and encourage them to live in the Rogue Valley."

Recognizing the need for nurses and the importance of education, Ruth Evans created the nursing scholarship in 2002 around the time of the death of her husband, Dr. William G. Evans, who had been a family physician for 50 years in Pennsylvania before moving to Ashland. Mrs. Evans passed away in 2013, leaving a bequest in excess of \$2.5 million dollars to the Ashland Community Hospital Foundation for nursing scholarships and other programs she cared about.

Since 2002, 148 scholarships valued at more than \$339,400 have been awarded to 103 aspiring nurses studying at the OHSU program at SOU or at RCC.


